

Foreword from the Editor

The special topic of this issue of *Diametros* is “ethics for professions” – various aspects of ethics designed specifically for representatives of certain professions and/or concerned with the specific moral problems that they face in their professional life. Two articles in this section were provided by American authors: Mark G. Kuczewski (Loyola University Chicago) discusses the problems of teaching biomedical ethics in the United States, and Lucia D. Wocial (Indiana University School of Nursing) considers bioethics education for nurses. Other articles are articles by Polish authors concerning: the teaching of ethics in general (Barbara Chyrowicz), ethics of the legal professions (Hubert Izdebski), business ethics, especially the ethical education of managers (Anna Lewicka-Strzałecka), engineering ethics (Marek Pyka), military ethics (Tomasz Żuradzki) and journalistic ethics (Jan Wawrzyniak). All of these articles, except for the last one, are derived from papers presented at the “Ethics for professions - what sort and for whom?” web conference, organized by the Interdisciplinary Center for Ethics of the Jagiellonian University and the Institute of Philosophy of the Jagiellonian University (18-20 June 2010).
